## The State of Our Budget

The Chapel Hill Bird Club (CHBC) is a tax exempt organization starting its 39<sup>th</sup> consecutive<sup>1</sup> fall semester with full disclosure as to its financial health. We collect yearly dues of \$15 and this hasn't changed for as long as I've been a member, more than 10 years. Fortunately, dues and small friendly donations have been sufficient to keep us in the black and paying our few bills. Our three major expenses are: 1) a \$65 monthly room rental to Binkley Baptist Church where we typically meet 8 months out of the year, 2) payment of the Orange County Christmas Bird Count at \$5 per counter, which runs close to \$200 each year, and 3) most years a donation to hummingbird bander Susan Campbell. We reduced operating expenses by several hundred dollars a year when we moved from snail mail posting of the CHBC Bulletin to electronic delivery. Our projector was purchased largely with donations (85%) in 2007. We start the new semester with a balance of \$1061 and an active membership of about 60 members. We are financially

healthy and adapting to a changing world, but a constant in our club is the love of birds and nature, and our desire to share knowledge and our experiences exploring the natural world.
